Web Search

In short, users can register ahead of time and in the event of a natural disaster such as a hurricane, they can post a message on the site for their friends and family ensuring that people can find each other when they need too.

Voicemail

In addition, members of the site are assigned a username and password, and a voicemail box extension. In the event of a natural disaster, they can call their voicemail box via a toll-free number and leave a "Safe&Sound" message for loved ones. Members associated with the account call the same toll-free number and can listen to messages after they provide proper identification.

On-Site Communications

In addition to the Voicemail and Web Search service offerings, our team members travel to emergency and disaster impacted communities that have lost all power and communications capabilities. Partnering with local shelters, churches, and organizations providing shelter to displaced individuals and families, we provide impacted communities with a mini mobile communications center equipped with phones and netbooks utilizing satellite services.

With Hurricane season starting in June and lasting until November, more than 35 million people live in areas that could potentially be affected by hurricanes this year. 2008 was a tumultuous year for hurricanes in the Gulf Coast and yet according to AT&T, more than 1/3 of residents say that they have not even thought about what their emergency communications plan should be.
